Hope Springs Eternal

In her 20-plus years of writing award-winning Christian fiction, **Francine Rivers** has certainly spun her fair share of engaging tales. But as diverse as the storylines of her span-the-genre novels are, the tie that inevitably binds her work together is always hope. **By Christa A. Banister**

Even though she's written 25 novels since she officially made her Christian fiction debut with *Redeeming Love* in 1991, Francine Rivers still gets a little nervous whenever her latest release date rolls around.

And once *Her Daughter's Dream* (Tyndale House), the sequel to the *New York Times* bestseller *Her Mother's Hope*, hit store shelves, she still couldn't help wondering how her readers would respond.









"I still get butterflies—lots of them," Francine confesses. "I guess I'm never sure how readers will take a new project or I've rendered the story fully. I always start with a question about something in my faith walk or an issue I need to work through. I'm on a personal quest to find God's perspective."

Through that process, she's waiting for that "epiphany moment" when she realizes what God is trying to teach her through that particular story. "But that doesn't necessarily mean readers are going to be pleased with the final product," Francine says. "All I can do is hope readers will be along for the journey and will come away encouraged at the end."

THE LATEST CHAPTER

Given the longevity of her career in the always-fickle fiction marketplace and the warm reception she consistently receives from critics and on countless fan pages, Francine doesn't exactly have to worry about what people will think. But her commitment to her craft and her fervency in communicating about matters of faith pushes her to do better.

In both *Her Mother's Hope* and *Her Daughter's Dream*, the story sprang from Rivers' questions of why her own mother and grandmother were "somewhat estranged" at the end of her grandmother's life. "My mother's feelings were deeply hurt by the situation, and she tried to work things out," Francine shares. "It was difficult to write, and the first draft—which was 1,200 pages long—didn't work. It wasn't until I allowed the characters Marta and Hildemara to become 'real' in and of themselves and not try to force them into molds of my grandmother and mother that the story began to work. What I learned through the process is we need to know the background and experiences that shaped our parents' lives."



In *Her Daughter's Dream*, Rivers talks about how history does have the tendency of repeating itself from generation to generation. “Unless we recognize what we’re doing wrong, we can’t change,” Rivers says. “Repentance comes from a broken and contrite heart, but in the end builds us up rather than tearing us down. What I hope readers will take from this story is a deep desire to know their family members, to listen intently, to say ‘I love you’ openly and without fear—or expectations. I hope the story will encourage generations to build bridges and share their life experiences.”

FROM THE 1950S TO THE MODERN AGE

This time around, readers benefit from the perspective of Hildie’s daughter Carolyn Arundel in *Her Daughter's Dream*, which is set in multiple decades—ranging from the 1950s to the modern age. Basically, when Carolyn’s mother is sick with tuberculosis and quarantined to her room until she gets better, Carolyn starts bonding with her grandmother Marta, who steps in and helps with the household duties in Hildie’s absence.


Like those modern-day instances where too much time with family starts a major rift, Hildie and Marta start getting into it, and Carolyn thinks she’s the one to blame. Lo and behold, once Carolyn has a daughter, the sick cycle starts again. But after learning what happened in her family’s past, she’s determined to be a bridge, rather than the person who tears her family apart again.

“If they’re willing to work at it, families *can* draw closer,” Francine says. “Hardships come in all sizes, but when we trust in the Lord and follow His ways, the difficult things in life don’t have to tear us apart. They can actually make our faith stronger, and equip us to help one another. We can pull together, especially if we’re willing to share our experiences and hope.”




As for how to make this happen when the going gets tough, Francine looks to the Bible for inspiration. “I don’t believe ‘venting’ is a good thing,” Francine says. “Feelings can be shared openly as long as we do so with mutual respect. It’s not easy to come close to someone who has hurt you, but it is possible. Jesus said, ‘Love one another as I have loved you.’” It wasn’t a suggestion. *Love one another* is a commandment. Love isn’t a feeling—it’s action. It isn’t just what we say, but how we say it and what we do. I pray readers will reach out to estranged family members. The best relationships are not built on the worldly idea of ‘what’s in it for me,’ but on faith in Jesus. Even if a relationship cannot be restored, we can be healed. We can forgive. We can move on without regrets and still keep doors open.”

THE NEXT CHAPTER

Now that the “Marta’s Legacy” series has drawn to a close, the Northern California native is in the very, *very* beginning stages of figuring out what she’ll work on next. But in the meantime she’s enjoyed reading a biography of Maria Edgewood, a family antecedent on the Rivers’ side of the family who was a writer of great reputation. Not only was Edgewood said to be Queen Victoria’s favorite novelist, but her work also had an impact on Sir Walter Scott and Jane Austen.

“I love mixing it up with what I read and enjoy many genres,” Francine says. “And right now I’m loving this biography.”

As for whether she’s climbed on the social networking bandwagon, the renowned writer says she’s been better at keeping up with family online than anything else. “Email has enabled me to ‘talk’ frequently with my brother, children, grandchildren, one cousin, and a few close friends,” Francine says. “I’m still learning about blogging. I’m always

worried I’m wasting people’s time. I find it very difficult to stay up to date with groups—especially writers’ groups. Writers love to write! And I’m a slow reader. Time is very precious and I have to make decisions on how best to use it. I’m usually a week or more behind in answering readers’ letters.”

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


DAY IN COURT

Bestselling author Robert Whitlow and filmmaker Gary Wheeler discussing bringing Whitlow's *The Trial* to the screen By C.J. Darlington



When attorney Robert Whitlow was growing up, he had no ambition to be a novelist. He only realized he wanted to be a lawyer in college. But almost fifteen years ago an idea for a story came to him while driving—it became his novel *The List*,

the first of his books to be made into a movie by North Carolina producer/director Gary Wheeler of Level Path Productions.

Now Team Whitlow/Wheeler have come together again to make a movie based on Whitlow's second novel, *The Trial* (Thomas Nelson). But how do you distill a 400 page novel into a 90 page script without losing the story's essence? "We asked ourselves, *What's the story we want to tell?*" Wheeler shares.

"Robert wrote the novel years ago, and the element of dealing with grief was just a portion of the novel. But we realized that was what the theme of the movie was going to be."

There's a reason they chose that theme. "Two-and-a-half years ago our daughter-in-law died of leukemia," Whitlow says. "She was pregnant with our first grandson, and we lost both of them."

Add Wheeler: "What Robert thought he knew about the grief process, he basically had to walk through with this. What he learned was that grief is like a river. Those lines from the movie that really aren't in the book, that's what he learned about grief through this tragedy."

"It's a collaborative effort," Whitlow says. "The rule we try to apply is if we come up with an idea or a little nuance, that I wish I'd put in the novel, it goes in the movie."

Wheeler agrees. "Robert doesn't hold his books precious. He believes in the power of film to transform. I'd say 80-percent of the movie is from the book, but that only represents about 20-percent of the novel."

A courtroom drama in the vein of Wheeler's favorite film, *To Kill A Mockingbird*,



The Trial is based on experiences Whitlow had early in his career. “There’s nothing like going into a courtroom when someone’s life has been taken, and somebody’s life is on the line,” Whitlow says solemnly. “It’s just inherently dramatic.”

In the case of *The Trial*, a young woman has been murdered and the accused—the last person to see her alive—has no memory of what happened. It’s up to attorney Mac Maclain to fight for the life of his client. He’s also fighting for his own will to live in the face of losing his wife and son in a car accident that happened while he was behind the wheel.

A fight was in store for the filmmakers, too. Wheeler’s first choice for the actor to play Mac—Matthew Modine—wasn’t available during the casting process because he was doing a play. Then, two weeks before they were supposed to begin shooting the movie, the financing fell through.

It took six months to re-raise it. Eight days before filming was to start again, the part of Mac still wasn’t cast—but God provided in the eleventh hour: “The next morning I woke up and we got a call from Matthew Modine’s agent saying he’d finished his play and was going to read the script,” Wheeler says. “Because of the delay when we lost our financing, Matthew was now available. He wrapped his play on a Sunday and was on a plane Monday to shoot on Tuesday.”

Overall, the goal of Wheeler and Whitlow is to make movies that are artistically excellent and spiritually powerful. “With *The Trial* we wanted to make a movie that ninety-nine percent of the audience would say was a great movie,” Wheeler says. “And then I hope the one percent of people who need help moving on from a place of pain and grief, who need a touch, will get it.” **FF**



No longer welcome at the only home she’s ever known, Mariah Aubrey not only lives in seclusion in an abandoned gatehouse, but she’s got plenty of intriguing secrets to boot, including the fact that she (gasp!) moonlights as a writer.

Of course, things get really interesting once Captain Matthew Bryant arrives on the scene and starts leasing the estate. Intrigued by the beautiful woman living nearby, he has to figure out whether her scandalous past can ever lead to a promising future for the two of them.


But beyond the intriguing storyline, Julie ultimately hopes that readers will be reminded that second chances are available to anyone. “We all stumble and make mistakes,” the author says. “But through Christ, God offers us forgiveness, love and second chances. And that’s exactly what I wanted to convey in *The Girl in the Gatehouse*.”

When it comes to Amish fiction, few names are as big as Wanda Brunstetter, who has sold more than 5 million copies of her books.



more time in prayer and meditation, which strengthens our faith in God.”



One reason Wanda’s books remain favorites of Amish fiction readers is that her novels ring with truth—thanks in part to her connections to the Amish community through her family heritage.



"I worked as an undercover narcotics buyer," Jerry B. Jenkins says in his usual matter-of-fact way.



Short stories in teen magazines and the debate over Harry Potter turned her attention toward fiction, specifically teen novels. Initially, she wasn't sure of this new



From the time he outgrew aspiring to be a cowboy or an astronaut, Edgar Award-winning author Andrew Klavan wanted to tell stories.

Raised in Judaism, he lived most of his life as an agnostic before converting to Christianity. “When I started wrestling with faith I was afraid it would make me unrealistic, that I would have this rosy, silly, magical view of life,” Klavan says. “Instead, it enhanced my sense of reality, my sense of human motives, my sense of what was happening in the world.”

A quest for truth also plays a key role in Andrew’s latest novel, *The Truth of the Matter*. While his character Charlie West is

not autobiographical, a strong Christian faith is not the only thing Andrew has in common with the hero of his series: Both have black belts in karate (a skill that makes Charlie’s escapes a little more plausible) and both are fervent patriots. “I lived overseas for seven years,” Andrew explains, “and I came back realizing that America is special. We’re a nation based on an idea—the idea that all men are created equal, that our rights come from our Creator, not our government, that our rights are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, among others. I came back a patriot, not to this particular piece of earth, not to the specialness of us as human beings, but to that idea.”




than 450 radio stations. The animated series was introduced last summer on TBN's children's network Smile of a Child.

At only 22, filmmaker Kyle Prohaska already has the experience of a man twice his age.

Not only has he written, directed and produced the feature film *Standing Firm* on a shoestring budget, he's also an accomplished website designer. However, things haven't always come easily for this self-taught man. While making *Standing Firm* he and his crew faced many challenges, and found themselves on their knees more than once. God always came through—take, for example, the day their entire camera setup fell over in the mud and an important adapter quit working. Miraculously, after everyone prayed, it was fixed.

With a ministry model similar to Sherwood Pictures, Kyle and his team at Praise



Pictures believe church involvement is a must. Though their company is run independently from the church, all the actors in *Standing Firm* but one were church volunteers.

Inspired by the Casting Crowns song "American Dream," Kyle wrote the script for *Standing Firm* based on the idea of a father struggling with what happens when worldly things overtake what's really important. The movie focuses on a man working himself into the ground after the death of his wife. Foreclosure looms, and his son Steven is desperate to reach him in any way possible.

But what's really important to Kyle is proclaiming the Gospel in his movies.

"I don't intend to be a 'filmmaker who's a Christian,'" he says. "I fully intend to be a Christian filmmaker. While media is incredibly powerful, the Gospel wins in that fight. The Word of God pierces the heart of man in a way no amazing story ever could, because it's eternal truth. It has the power to leave an eternal impact *The Blind Side* would never leave on someone."



5 Questions: Nicole O'Dell

Written for tween girls faced with difficult decisions and lots of peer pressure, Nicole O'Dell's Scenarios for Girls series lets readers test their decision-making abilities in an eye-opening but safe way. Each book follows a character up to the point where she has to make an important, life-changing decision—then it's the reader's turn to choose!

When did you discover your love for writing?

When I was in fourth grade, I entered a district-wide literary contest. I had to take a blank, white, hardcover book and write a story with illustrations to fill it. My book, *The Girl on the Runaway Pogo-Stick*, took first place. It was printed and placed in the school libraries in my district. I was hooked from that moment.

I remember the process of writing that book. I was sitting on my bedroom floor, leaning against the side of my bed. As I was writing about the girl bouncing her way through town, passing all of the businesses and waving hello to various townspeople, I realized she'd need to pass them in reverse order on the way home. Something in me clicked, and I realized that things like that didn't just happen by accident in books; someone did it on purpose. Suddenly, I wanted to be that person—the one who made things happen and told the story.

What drew you to writing for the YA market?

When I was a young girl, my mom was my hero. I really believed she could do anything and that she knew everything. Somehow, when I entered my early teen years, that all changed; I became angry and really gave her a hard time. I regret much of those years now that I see the truth of them. My mom is now my very best friend. I wish I had known then what I know now and had some kind of grasp on just how temporary all of that angst and confusion really was.

Ever since I had my daughters, I have feared those years. My parenting has really been shaped by my desire

to avoid as much of that destruction as possible. My heart's desire is to reach hormonal, confused, pre-teen girls, and to protect them from themselves, and their families from the confusion that can ensue as the girls face those life changes.

For newcomers, how do you explain the Scenarios books?

In the Scenarios series, each main character is faced with many choices and moral dilemmas. Eventually, they find their choices have led them into a situation that requires them to make a very difficult and potentially life-altering moral decision. When the story has fully unfolded, and the main character arrives at that moment of truth, the reader makes the big decision for her and then turns to the corresponding section in the book where the resulting circumstances unfold.

This format places the responsibility for those decisions squarely on the reader's shoulders, in hopes she will learn from personal experience as she lives through the eyes of the book's character. She will learn the importance of good decisions as well as the truth about forgiveness and grace. Even when poor choices are made, the redemptive power of Christ is evident as forgiveness is sought, offered and received.

What are your goals for the future?

More than anything, I hope to grow this ministry for teen girls. I have a real passion for them and for the mother/daughter relationship; our enemy seeks to destroy the family, and one way he does that is by affecting teens through temptations and


emotions they aren't ready to face.

It seems that mothers and daughters often have the most difficult time during those years. On the horizon, I have speaking events and outreaches where I intend to bring a message of hope and promise to women and girls who are facing those difficult years.


What all can readers find on your website?

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
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
