


Q & A: Susan May Warren

The RITA Award-winning author of more than 30 novels, Susan May Warren served with her husband and four children as a missionary in Russia for eight years before they returned home. She now writes full-time as her husband runs a lodge on Lake Superior in northern Minnesota, where many of her books are set. In this interview, the author discusses the latest volume in her Deep Haven series, *My Foolish Heart* (Tyndale House).

Q: What would you like to tell us about *My Foolish Heart*?

I'm very excited about *My Foolish Heart* because it represents a return to Deep Haven, where my first novel, *Happily Ever After*, was set. It's a small town in northern Minnesota, set on Lake Superior, and is a town very much like the one I currently live in. More than that, it has all my favorite things in the story—football, donuts, a dog ... plus secrets, betrayal, surprises and sweet romances. It's a story about second chances and the power of perfect love. I hope readers will enjoy this fresh take on *You've Got Mail* set in a small town.



Q: This is your fourth trip back to Deep Haven—what is it about this town that keeps bringing you (and readers) back again and again?

I think it is the community, the dream of a simpler life, the beauty of the north shore, and the delicious romances. It's like a familiar vacation—you know what to expect, but each time you come away with sweeter memories.

Q: One of your characters in the book, Caleb Knight, is a veteran who is now hiding his disability. What inspired you to include this angle in your romance?

I kept thinking about the different online communications and how easy it might be to share your heart with someone if you didn't have the vulnerability of looking in their eyes as you shared your heart. What if you were hiding something, and it was something that made you "difficult" to know, like Caleb's disability, or Issy's private world? What if you found someone online that understood you—would you have the courage to face them with the truth of your secrets? I think there is always a fear about meeting someone you've gotten to know online—will they be as perfect in person?

I also wanted to show how Caleb, as well as Coach Presley, were amazing, capable people despite their disabilities. I think sometimes people with physical challenges can get forgotten, as if their opinions and skills aren't valuable anymore, and I wanted to show the fallacy in this.

Q: When Caleb needs romantic advice, he seeks help from a call-in show—which leaves him more confused than ever. What inspired the "call-in show" complication in your novel?

I was intrigued by these people who have spent years in their homes, yet have

online friends and a rich online life. Also, I wanted to have my hero and heroine get to know each other in a way that was intimate, but not face to face. Finally, I am always intrigued by people who give advice to strangers—how it affects the callers life, and wanted to explore this concept. Who are these callers? Does the advice the “therapist” gives nag at them? Do they worry about callers after they hang up?

Q: How much of yourself is in your characters?

An author always must pull from their own lives to create a realistic character, or realistic emotions for the characters. I pulled from feelings of being trapped, or afraid while living in Russia to create Issy, and feelings of frustration and pain from when I broke a bone in my neck and had to wear a neck brace for six month to create Caleb. (Although that wasn't near his challenges, I tried to tap into the emotion of being limited in physical capabilities.) I tapped into my feelings of lost love to create Polly, and the sense of wanting to be a hero in my hometown to create Seb. I also put into all the characters my love for football.

Q: Is your first goal to minister to readers—or to entertain them?

My goal is to tell a great story. A great story is always about a truth journey of a character—but that must be entertaining! I start out with the question—what would I like to read? Then I discover the characters, and ask them what lie they believe to discover the truth journey they are on. I never write to agenda, but I do find that every great book has a story-question, and a truth behind it. It's that universal truth that ministers to readers.

Q: What's the best thing anyone said about one of your books?

That it changed their lives and brought them back into a relationship with the Lord, or a family member.

Q: What do you most hope readers take away after reading your book?

That they can trust in God's perfect love for them regardless of what happens in life. It's a hard concept that we have to hold onto, but one that, I believe, can change the way we see our lives.

Q: Why do you think story is such a powerful way to share truth?

Jesus told stories—sometimes called parables!—and they stick with us because we see ourselves in them. I hope that in my books people both see themselves...as well as see truth that can change their lives. **FF**

JUST LIKE US

Award-winning, best-selling author Wanda E. Brunstetter became fascinated with the Amish way of life when she first visited her husband's Mennonite relatives living in Pennsylvania. Her novels have since appeared on many bestseller lists, including the *New York Times*, *Publisher's Weekly*, Evangelical Christian Publisher's Association and more—last fall, she surpassed 5 million book sales. Her latest series, *Kentucky Brothers*, launched in April with *The Journey*. By C.J. Darlington



As a little girl, Wanda Brunstetter always had a book in her hand. “I was either reading, or I was writing,” she says. “I grew up in a dysfunctional home, so it was great to pretend and take myself to other places. I immersed myself in books.”

Now she's the one creating the stories, and readers can't get enough of her best-selling Amish novels. In a way, she credits her tough upbringing with her desire to write about the simple life. “Because of what I went through as a kid, I have more empathy for people and their problems,” Wanda says. It's also helped her to tap into the emotions of her characters. “Sometimes my writing moves me to tears. I can feel the pain of the character.”

But even though her childhood wasn't stable, her mother did take her to church, and it was there Wanda found the Lord through a caring Sunday School teacher. “I was so desperately seeking something to hang onto,” Wanda says. “I was very open to the plan of salvation when she shared it with our class. I was young, six or seven, but it really hit home with me. It was

exactly what I needed—a heavenly father that I could count on. Through my teen years I was active in our teen group. I kind of walked away from it a little bit during my older teen years trying to find myself, but never to the extremes some people do. I always knew God was right there with me. Thank God He was. “Some of what I went through I've brought out in a few of my novels,” Wanda says. “Those have been the most difficult books to write. When my husband and I got married, we both decided we were going to change the mold and do things differently for our children. Not that we were perfect parents, but we really tried. We put effort into making our kids have a normal life with stability. I wanted my kids to feel safe, to know when they came home that Mom and Dad would be there.”

It was actually her husband's Mennonite relatives who first showed Wanda how beautiful the love of a family could be. “Four of his brothers married Mennonite girls,” Wanda adds. “I felt so different when I was with that part of his family. They gave me a sense of

peace and belonging like I'd never had. It was their faith and the way they spoke to me and each other. There was just a peacefulness about their countenance. When I'm with our Amish friends, I come away feeling so blessed, like I've been ministered to because they have such a wonderful family unit. They care so much about each other. You can just feel it.”

This is something Wanda strives to weave into her stories. She believes people are hungry for change in their lives. “We're all looking for some way to get back to the simple life, to family! For me, being with the Amish, I see them put God first and family second. So many of us Englishers have our priorities mixed up. We're so caught up in the world and our goals and everything that's expected of us. I think people have a deep desire to get back to the basics. The Amish are an example to us in that respect. Not that they're perfect; they'd be the first to admit they're not. Knowing the Amish as I know them, I understand their lives aren't always slow either. They can be pretty busy going a hundred different directions, but they still have that peaceful way about them.”

Wanda has written novels that take place in several different Amish communities, but it was a visit to Kentucky that inspired her to write the Kentucky Brothers trilogy, which begins with *The Journey*. “We discovered that the Amish in the Hawkinsville area are actually implants from Lancaster County,”

Wanda says. “We felt like we were in Lancaster because there were the same gray buggies, and the clothing was the same too. But this community is much smaller, and there aren't a bunch of tourists and places selling Amish things. They're a little more withdrawn. You have to really work at getting to know them. I think they want it that way. They've moved there for a reason, to pull away from being the center of attention. I felt I needed to set a story there. It's beautiful country.

“I also have some Amish friends whose daughter recently moved from Indiana to an Amish community in Oklahoma due to her husband losing his job. I watched the impact her move had on the family. It kills them when their family leaves. I thought that would be a good topic to deal with: how do Amish parents deal with their kids leaving home? They feel like we do, only it hits them even harder because they are so close as a family.”

One of the main characters in *The Journey* is a young woman who's taken up carpentry, a profession usually reserved for men, especially among the Amish. This at first seems unusual, but Wanda explains how it's not as unusual as it might appear. “I've seen Amish women do things that surprise you,” she says. “One lady I know owns a store with her husband where they make and sell windows. She's very active in the business. Amish women are becoming more independent in that they can have a business. They often run or oversee them.” And while the novels in the Kentucky Brothers trilogy do stand alone, they're tied together by the fact that three brothers from Lancaster County end up moving to Kentucky for different reasons. *The Journey* follows Titus, an identical twin who feels he's living in his brother's shadow. He needs a fresh start, and going to Kentucky is his answer. “At least he thinks it is!”

Wanda says with a smile.

Writing is most definitely Wanda's passion, but just like her characters, sometimes she might surprise you. She's written nine children's books (with a brand new kids series coming out next year), has a historical novella coming out in a Christmas collection, and is a professional ventriloquist. Yes, that's right. When she and her husband wanted to add something to their puppet ministry, her husband learned how to make twisty balloon animals and Wanda picked up a book and studied ventriloquism.

"I've always been interested in ventriloquism," she says. "I practiced in front of a mirror and determined to do it without moving my lips." She's gotten so skilled she's even taught classes and written articles on the subject. "The biggest key besides the art of not moving your lips is sound substitutions," Wanda says. "There are certain letters in the English language you can't say without moving your lips. You have to learn those substitutions and put your tongue in a certain spot in your mouth so they actually come out right. It was just a matter of practicing that over and over and over and finding the positions that worked best for me. All the kids were just in awe when I did it in an Amish schoolhouse. They thought I must have a tape recorder. I have two little puppets who are dressed up in Amish clothes too, and the kids love it!"

Wanda's love for the Amish comes through in everything she says and writes, but there's one thing she wishes the Amish would embrace from their English friends—electricity! "How am I going to curl my hair?" Wanda says, chuckling. "Charge my laptop and cell phone? I would like to see them take advantage of more modern things, and yet I know that if they do they might end up in the same whirlwind we're in, where we can't let go of them and they become idols."

The Amish and their ways can often seem enigmatic to those of us on the outside, but through stories like Wanda's we can begin to see the Amish as people just like us. Most importantly, Wanda wants us to realize they're our brothers and sisters in Christ.

"Some people feel like the Amish aren't Christian," she says. "We get that misconception because they're so different. To know the Amish as we know them, you would know they are definitely Christians. One of our Amish friends is a minister in the Amish church, and when he was asked if Amish is his religion, he said, 'No. Amish is our way of life. Jesus Christ is our religion.'"

"That sums it up perfectly. I'm not saying every Amish person is a born again believer any more than every person who attends a Protestant church is a born-again believer. But many of them are, and I don't think people realize that. The Amish just don't proclaim it to the world like we do. They feel their actions are an example to the world." **FF**

The “Love Finds You” series of inspirational romance novels celebrates a country full of towns and cities with great names, neat personalities, and colorful histories. **Rel Mollet** talks with some of the authors behind these books.

Summerside Press was a small publisher with a big dream when it unveiled the first books in its regional romance line: *Love Finds You in Miracle, Kentucky* by Andrea Boeshaar and *Love Finds You in Snowball, Arkansas* by Sandra D. Bricker. Combining travel, romance and faith, the Love Finds You™ series draws on the fascinating history or the unique character of a town in the United States, often with a quirky name. With published or contracted novels set in 33 American states, Summerside Press is well on its way to its goal of publishing at least one novel in each of the 50 US states.


Summerside’s Fiction Editorial Director, Rachel Meisel, explains the unique qualities of the Love Finds You series. “Unlike traditional regional romance, The Love Finds You series features inspirational romance novels set in actual towns and cities across

North America; they combine the best of what readers love—romance and travel—in one package. Each novel draws on the compelling history or unique character of a real place, giving readers a taste of local life across this wonderfully diverse country. The stories are in fact quite educational; many libraries and schools are picking them up because they provide a fun way for readers to explore the nooks and crannies of North America.”

Two new Love Finds You books release every other month and are a mixture of contemporary and historical stories set in towns such as Romeo, Colorado; Hershey, Pennsylvania; and Groom, Texas. can be transported to exotic locales they'd love to visit in person—or different centuries they never will. It's an appealing promise at a time when many of us are having to downsize our vacation budgets."



MIRALEE FERRELL

Miralee Ferrell's *Love Finds You in Last Chance, California* was the fifth LFY book to release in early 2009 and the first of three she has now written. Says Miralee, "It was a brand new concept when I started. I loved the idea that we could do contemporary, historical, suspense, chic lit, etc., as long as it had a strong romantic thread. What fun to choose the style that best fit my voice, while setting it in a place that actually existed." Visiting the locations and discovering actual events has been a bonus for Miralee. Regarding her latest story, *Love Finds You In Tombstone, Arizona*, Miralee shares, "I unearthed a story about a woman shot in the arm during a stage robbery who promised

one of the robbers not to reveal his identity if he took off his mask and bound up her arm—the mask kept slipping around and he couldn't see well enough to tend to her arm. She kept his secret the rest of her life, even when badgered by a Wells Fargo agent to turn the man in. My heroine, Christy, was also shot on her way into Tombstone when the Wells Fargo payroll was stolen, and she too agreed not to reveal the outlaw's identity." MiraleeFerrell.com




MELANIE DOBSON

Liberty turned out to be the perfect setting since it was a main stop on the Underground Railroad." Since *Love Finds You In Liberty, Indiana*, Melanie has added *Love Finds You in Homestead, Iowa* and her June release, *Love Finds You in Amana, Iowa*, loving every minute of the research required. "When I researched for the Liberty book, I was invited into people's homes to explore the secret spaces that had once hidden runaway slaves. When I wrote the

books for Homestead and Amana, I felt like I stepped back in time as I explored the Colonies by foot and bicycle and then tasted the wonderful food and pastries baked in the open hearth—it's hard work doing all this research! I love meeting the people, reading the old newspapers, and discovering the legacy of each town.”

“Many Amish books take place on farms in the midst of large Amish communities. The community in West Kootenai, Montana is set



Ginger Garrett's latest historical novel is based on actual German witch trials in the early 1500s—but her focus is not on witchcraft.







With her thriller *Over the Edge*, Brandilyn Collins takes the saying “write what you know” literally.

In 2002-2003 she suffered a debilitating case of Lyme disease. God miraculously healed her, but she hasn’t forgotten its devastating effects. This helped her write *Over the Edge’s* main character, Janessa McNeil, who is purposely infected with Lyme by someone and given an ultimatum—convince her doctor husband to publicly reverse his stance on Lyme, or their young daughter will be infected next.

But Janessa’s husband doesn’t believe she even has Lyme, like many real-life doctors and their patients, according to Collins. This disbelief in the severity of the disease isn’t fiction for Lyme sufferers, to which Collins can also attest. Only when she was reinfected in 2009 (she’s since recovered) did she know it



was time to pen a novel that would bring to the forefront what has become known as the Lyme Wars, a struggle between Lyme literate doctors and powerful organizations such as the Centers for Disease Control. “I remember slumping in the waiting room of my doctor’s office in 2003, so sick I could not remain sitting in the chair,” Collins says.

Mocking her on the wall was a framed medical journal article explaining how Lyme is never chronic and is easily treatable.

“Even my family members and close friends, who saw me suffer from Lyme, have commented that after reading *Over the Edge*

their eyes were opened to the suffering caused by Lyme,” Collins says. And that’s her goal with this novel—to shine a spotlight on the challenges those in the Lyme community face through a story that will keep you on the edge of your seat.








Mitchell is currently making an intermittent attempt to get words on pages as he balances a full course load at the University of Idaho, a part-time job, and writing the final book of the trilogy.


The theme running through the pages of *Bound by Guilt* is the need for forgiveness.



“There are so many influences out there; I want to be a good one.”





The Allison O'Brian series is a glimpse into the past in more than one way.

It's an adventure set against a post-World War II backdrop—but it's also a glimpse into the early writing of Melody Carlson, the prolific and popular writer of more than 200 books, from the critically acclaimed *Finding Alice* to children's picture books to teen series like *Diary of a Teenage Girl*.

"Allison O'Brian's story was my second book to write," Carlson reflects. "The first one was written longhand on a legal pad and that book remains safely tucked away."

While the story of Allison O'Brien's search for love and family (she never knew her father and her mother is a glamorous movie star) was originally written at the beginning of Carlson's career, she believes because they're semi-historical, the books are timeless. She chose to set the books just after World War II for a couple reasons. "I felt that was an interesting and romantic era," she says, "a time when servicemen were coming


home and life was returning to normal. Because they were set in my mother's era, they hold a special place in my heart. I queried her and my aunt for information about the late '40s and they both read all four books, giving me helpful feedback."

Melody wants the books to hold a special place in her readers' hearts as well. "I hope readers simply enjoy the story for the adventure it is, but I also hope they'll bond with Allison. She has such a longing for family, heritage, craving a space where she will fit in. In some ways not so different from pre-teens today.

Also, she has her own spiritual awakening when she learns to trust God for her otherwise shaky sort of life."






Shattered Dreams



When a shark attack left teen Bethany Hamilton without an arm, she didn't lose her faith.

Her story has recently been told in the inspiring movie *Soul Surfer*, but you might not know that, years earlier, Bethany's youth leader Sarah Hill (played by Carrie Underwood in the film) also suffered a life-changing surfing accident. "I went to duck dive under a wave," Hill says. "I got tossed backwards and landed on my head. The impact was as if I hit cement. I broke my neck and back. I was 1/16th of an inch away from being paralyzed."

Hill's dreams were shattered as she questioned God's plan. "I had never really experienced the Lord speaking to me in my life," she says. "I did the church thing with my family, but it was never a personal relationship with the Lord. He began to show me that even though I had a tough life coming from an abusive home, He never allowed anything to overcome me and take me out. I recommitted my life to the Lord, and I've walked with Him ever since."

That walk eventually led her to Kauai, Hawaii. One summer at a youth camp she met Bethany Hamilton. "Through being a youth leader to Bethany, God allowed us to develop a really close friendship, like a sistership," Hill says. "As I was on my way to the hospital the day Bethany was attacked I was praying,

'Lord, how do I minister to this family? What do I say to them?' That still small voice popped the verse from Jeremiah into my head that's used in the movie: 'For I know the plans I have for Bethany, plans of good and not of evil, to give her a future and a

hope.' It brought back to my memory that He had always used Bethany as a light in a dark industry, and now He was going to use her as a voice. That was the Lord's promise to Bethany and the Hamiltons."




Phil Vischer started his latest series after research showed how little most Christian kids know about their faith—and how many walk away from the church after high school.







5 Questions: Dan Walsh

Dan Walsh is the award-winning author of *The Unfinished Gift*, *The Homecoming* and *The Deepest Waters*. A member of American Christian Fiction Writers, Dan served as a pastor for 25 years. He lives with his family in the Daytona Beach area, where he's busy researching and writing his next novel.



DAN WALSH

Tell us about *The Deepest Waters*.

I watched this documentary about a paddlewheel steamship which sank after a hurricane in September 1857. Tons of gold went to the bottom of the sea, along with over 400 souls. Among the few survivors there was a honeymoon couple who thought they'd been parted forever. How this couple survived and the way they were reunited was nothing short of miraculous. So *The Deepest Waters* is inspired by these true events.

But as I began to write, a new main character emerged named Micah. He's an old, illiterate Negro slave who has this abounding joy and Christ-like demeanor, even though his life is filled with suffering and loss.

How long did it take you to get to this place as a writer?

I began my first novel in 1997, got about halfway through, then set it aside for 10 years. Didn't write a thing that entire time. In the summer of 2007, at my wife's urging, I finished *The Unfinished Gift* and got signed, almost immediately, with my agent. She

had a contract with Revell in a few months.

After one of your books comes out and you see the response, does that affect how you approach the next book?

If anything, it has only strengthened me to "stay the course." The responses I've received with my first two novels, and already from *The Deepest Waters*, have touched me deeply.

What part of a story do you find hardest to write?


When I have to put my characters through heartbreak and suffering. I know it must happen. It's part of life and what makes the story relevant and gives it meaning. I even know as I write these difficult parts that, down the road, all things "will work together for good." But still, it's hard. The characters become almost real to me. I wish I could yell to them, "Hold on, don't give up hope."

When I do finally get to write the scenes where these tragedies resolve, I often cry. I've cried numerous times writing all of my books. I'm sure I look

like an idiot when this happens. I've learned not to write these scenes in public places.

What aspect of God do you most hope readers get from reading your work?

I want my readers to be thoroughly entertained—but I also want them to experience a quiet revelation of God's nature in the story, too. His beauty, kindness, mercy and incredible patience. I don't want to be preachy in my books, but I am always on the lookout for creative and subtle ways to help us catch glimpses of this magnificent Savior. **FF**
