ROMANTIC SUSPENSE Lynette Eason Double Take

Lynette Eason is the USA Today bestselling author of the Extreme Measures, Danger Never Sleeps, Blue Justice, Women of Justice, Deadly Reunions, Hidden Identity, and Elite Guardians Series. She is the winner of three ACFW Carol Awards, the Selah Award, and the Inspirational Reader's Choice Award, among others. She is a graduate of the University of South Carolina and has a master's degree in education from Converse College.

In this interview, Lynette talks with us about her new novel, **Double Take**, the first book in her new **Lake City Heroes**Series.

FF: Double Take is the first book in the Lake City Heroes Series. What was the inspiration for this series?

I'm not sure I was inspired—more like I grabbed some writer buddies and held them hostage until we figured it out. Seriously, I have some great author friends who never hesitate to do some brainstorming. I did want the series to stay true to my voice and genre. With *Double Take*, I actually had an outline I wrote probably three years ago. The idea came to me and I jotted it down, but I didn't really have a place for it. Until it was time to submit the contract for the next series. I went back over the idea, made some tweaks, and knew that it was the perfect first book idea for this series.





FF: What is the connecting element between all the books in your series?

The connecting element is the cast of characters and the setting. The stories are set in the fictional town of Lake City, North Carolina, about an hour outside of Asheville.

FF: Can you please tell readers about your protagonists, Lainie Jackson and James Cross?

Lainie and James have a complicated relationship from the get-go. One of her best friends is James's sister, Stephanie, who she's known forever. And Lainie's had a crush on James for about that long. But she was resigned that he'd never see her as anything more than his younger sister's friend, so when her ex came along, she was vulnerable. James, on the other hand, had vowed never to let his heart be vulnerable again. When you let people get close, they have too much power to hurt you. Then along came Lainie, and now he's fighting to keep her alive and out of his heart all at the same time.

FF: How did your characters meet?

They've known each other since childhood.

FF: Both Lainie and James are struggling through past issues. How are they able to help themselves while helping each other? Lainie and James learn a lot from each other. Honestly, James is the only man in the world who could win Lainie's trust after her experience with her ex-fiancé. And she still has the occasional doubt. Outside of his siblings, James has never really had anyone stand up for him and tell others that he's not the loser he sometimes feels he is. When he overhears Lainie defending him to his father, he's a goner. And it takes both of them to catch a killer, so there's that.

FF: What are some of the main themes covered in Double Take?

Some of the main themes include forgiveness, reconciliation, loyalty, second chances, and sacrificial love.

FF: What do you hope readers will experience when reading your novel?

First of all, of course I hope that readers love the story itself, that they're thoroughly entertained. Second, I hope that the inner battles the characters face can somehow resonate with readers and draw them closer to the Savior. **FF**




In this interview, Colleen talks with us about her latest book, **Break of Day**.

FF: What inspired the story in your book?

Readers have loved my Rock Harbor Series so much, and I wanted to catch up with the gang there. I decided a spin-off series made more sense, and I love 2nd chance romance stories. There are always unresolved conflicts in those kinds of novels that make for a fun story to write. There's a surprise twist early on in the series that took 3 books to work out, and I hope readers enjoy it!

FF: What can you tell us about the main characters in your book?

Annie Pederson is a law enforcement park ranger. She's a widow with a daughter and she's driven to find out what happened to her little sister who was kidnapped when she was five. That's an important thread that weaves through the series. Jon Dunstan is an orthopedic surgeon (I know way more



about orthopedic surgery than anyone should know from firsthand experience)! He and Annie broke up when he went off to college. It takes a lot to resolve all their issues!

FF: Which character surprised you the most?

Annie knew a lot more about survival in the woods then I realized going into the series.

FF: Why do you think storytelling is such a powerful way to share truth?

There is emotion attached to story, and it penetrates to the heart in a personal way. As readers, we experience those same emotions and understand what our characters understand. I'm a voracious reader and always have a book in my hand. Story helps me see so many perspectives other than my own.

FF: What can you tell us about your next book?

I'm super excited to share my next standalone with readers! *Fragile Designs* is a story I've thought about for twenty years. A widow with an infant, Carly Harris finds a mysterious egg in her great-grandmother's belongings, and it plunges her headfirst into mounting danger as she unravels the secrets of a missing Faberge egg.

FF: How do you get into the right frame of mind to write for your genre/audience?

I love romantic suspense. It's what I read myself. I always travel to the location as well, and this time, I spent some time reading nonfiction about the great woods up north. I needed that sense of isolation and foreboding.

FF: What do you want readers to take away after reading your book?

There are several layers of 2nd chances, and I hope readers remember it's never too late to make amends.

FF: What are the biggest challenges for you as an author writing in your specific genre?

Since I write suspense, it's important to me to make sure readers still end up with hope at the end. I try hard not to dwell on the power of evil because God always wins. Yes, bad things can happen to us, but it's not the end. There's a popular song right now I love titled "Fear is Not My Future." Nothing that happens in this life is our future—God is. Heaven is our future. Nothing can overcome us in this life because it's not the end.


FF: What authors or books have inspired you as an author? My dear friend and fellow author, Diann Hunt, went home to be with the Lord 10 years ago this year, and I've been thinking a lot about her impact on my life. She faced ovarian cancer with such courage and faith. She taught me to face adversity with humor and a deep love for Jesus, no matter what. I was by her side when she stepped into heaven, and I caught a glimpse of it that night. If you've never read a Diann Hunt novel, find one! You're in for a treat of laughter, love, and faith.

FF: How has your faith or world view impacted the way you tell stories?

My faith is the lens through which I see the world. As I write this, I've been through a 2-week ordeal of not being able to see after cataract surgery. Yesterday the blurry lens that wasn't working for me was replaced with a different kind and everything is suddenly vivid and true again. That's how my faith impacts my life—it lets me see things clearly so I'm not consumed by fear. **FF**


In this interview, Irene talks with us about kicking-off her new *Undaunted Courage Series* with the release of book one, *Into the Fire*.

FF: Please provide a brief summary of Into the Fire.

Here's my one-sentence elevator pitch: A fire investigator and ATF agent join forces to track down a serial arsonist who will stop at nothing—including murder—to carry out a nefarious plan. (Romance ensues as well, of course!)

FF: What was the inspiration for your new novel?

I've written many law-enforcement related books featuring a variety of crimes, but never anything fire-related. This story gave me an opportunity to do that. Plus, after researching the fascinating world of smokejumpers, I knew it was the perfect background for my strong and determined heroine.





FF: This is the first book in the *Undaunted Courage Series*. **How many books will there be and what ties them together?** There will be three books in the series. The link between the books it that they feature three foster siblings from difficult backgrounds. Each story spotlights one of the siblings, but the other two siblings do make appearances in that book.

FF: What do readers have to look forward to in the rest of the *Undaunted Courage Series*?

Book 2 will feature Jack Tucker, a homicide detective, who must determine whether the sole witness in a murder case has lost her grip on reality or whether someone is conducting a relentless campaign to destroy her credibility...and perhaps her life. In book 3, the youngest sibling, Cara Tucker, takes center stage. She's a historical anthropologist on sabbatical at a remote estate, where she's researching a vanishing language. When she finds herself caught up in a century-old mystery and murder, however, the local sheriff must track down the killer before he or she strikes again.

FF: Your two protagonists, Bri Tucker and Marc Davis, have very unique professions. What type of research was required to accurately portray their roles?

As I always tell people, while I write fiction, the professions and agencies and law enforcement protocols I write about are real. Since I'm a stickler for accuracy, I do huge amounts of research to ensure I portray these correctly. In this case, I found plenty of material online about smokejumpers, including female smokejumpers. That was invaluable. For the arson plot element that was unique to my story, I worked with a retired fire chief/fire marshal, who reviewed the scenarios I created. Those kinds of sources help put the final polish of authenticity on my stories.

FF: In Bri's new role as a fire investigator, she inherits a curious puzzle from her predecessor. What type of questions does this puzzle raise for Bri?

After the death of a retired colleague, Bri realizes he may have been on the brink of soliciting her help with several fires that had been ruled accidental but which continued to trouble him. But she has almost nothing to go on. What cases was he focused on? Why was he still concerned about them? Who were the victims? But when a few clues emerge that suggest his quest may have merit, Bri digs in...and suddenly finds herself in the crosshairs.

FF: What is the connection between Bri and Marc?

When Bri is assigned to investigate the suspicious death of her retired colleague, she's still relatively new to her job. Plus, it's a death that hits close to home for the department, and her boss wants to pull out all the stops. So he decides to have the ATF get involved too. That doesn't sit especially well with Bri, who'd prefer to work alone—but Marc ends up being an asset on

both the professional and personal front!

FF: The setting for *Into the Fire* is St. Louis, Missouri. Why did you choose this location?

All but one of my suspense novels are set in the St. Louis area. Since my stories tend toward psychological suspense and aren't generally location contingent, I can set them anywhere. I use St. Louis because I'm very familiar with that setting, and writing about it requires almost no research...which frees me up to research everything else in the book.

FF: What are some of the main themes covered in Into the Fire and what do you hope readers will gain from reading your book?

Forgiveness, self-esteem issues, overcoming challenges, finding the courage to trust, the importance of family, perseverance. All of those are in the book. Mostly what I try to do with my novels is tell a compelling story that entertains, encourages, and uplifts.

FF: What do you love most about writing romantic suspense novels?

The high stakes, the deep dive into the minds of multiple characters, and the gradual build toward a dramatic climax. I also like watching a romance develop as two characters grapple with dangerous situations. Those sorts of conditions bring emotions to the forefront and allow the characters (and the reader) to get a clear read on their strengths and weaknesses fairly fast. **FF**

In this interview, Tracie talks with us about her newest book, **Knowing You**, book number three in her *Pictures of the Heart Series*.

FF: Please provide a brief summary of Knowing You?

May Parker is an American artist who happens to be half white, half Japanese. She works at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition in 1909 Seattle. As one of many Camera Girls, May spends her days adding color to postcards and taking time to visit the Japanese Building where she learns about her heritage. Lee Munro is an old friend and police detective, who has been long absent from May's life due to prejudices felt by his family. When criminal interest in the samurai armor display suggests trouble, Lee and May are brought together to figure it out. In doing so, they also come to renew their friendship and interest in one another. Can God help them to overcome the prejudices of family and the world in order for their love to flourish?





FF: Knowing You is the final book in the *Pictures of the Heart Series*. What was the connecting element for all of the books in this series?

The Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition of 1909 brought millions of people to Seattle. This series shows a fictional group of "Camera Girls" who work taking souvenir photos of expoattendees and in the process, fall in love.

FF: Are there any threads that run through the whole series that will be wrapped up in this book?

There are a few in the form of the exposition itself, as well as what happens to several beloved characters.

FF: What are some of the main themes or lessons covered in *Knowing You*?

Dealing with racial prejudices. Facing the past to overcome the power it has on you. And not allowing other people to dictate your relationship with others, but rather looking to God for direction.

FF: Knowing You combines history and romance, but it also offers a thread of suspense. Can you provide a hint of the dangerous situation that May and her childhood friend Lee Munro encounter?

A notorious criminal comes back into Lee's life and threatens May's welfare, leading Lee to realize just how important May is to him.



I want them to see the simple ways God encourages us daily through His Word and others, and how we, too, can offer this encouragement to each other. **FF**

Voted #1 Reader's Favorite Christian Romance Author of 2019 by FamilyFiction, bestselling Christian fiction author **Karen Witemeyer** offers warmhearted historical romance with a flair for humor, feisty heroines, and swoon-worthy Texas heroes. She makes her home in Abilene, Texas, with her husband and three children.

In this interview, Karen discusses her latest novel, Fairest of Heart, book number one in her new Texas Ever After Series.

FF: Fairest of Heart is the first book in your new series that is launching in Summer 2023. Can you please tell us a little bit about the Texas Ever After Series?

As the name implies, *Texas Ever After* is a series of classic fairy tale retellings that have been given a Western spin. I've always adored fairy tales—the romance, the adventure, the battle between good over evil. Those elements find their way into all of my stories in one way or another, so why not pay more direct homage to the happily-ever-after tales I've adored since childhood? That is what this series is all about.

FF: Can these books be read out of order?

Yes. Each story in the series will be a stand-alone novel with no plotlines or characters carrying over into future books. The series is built on the theme of fairy tales, not on a set of specific characters, so order doesn't matter.





FF: What led you to choose the story of Snow White as the first of these fairy tale retellings?

The Snow White tale has so many iconic elements that are immediately recognizable. As soon as I mention that the heroine takes refuge at a ranch run by seven retired drovers, everyone knows the fairy tale used for inspiration. Besides that, the dwarves from the story we all knew as children have such distinct personalities. I had great fun bringing those to life. Throw in a Texas Ranger hero and a villainess with a fondness for mirrors, and the plot came together in a snap.

FF: What is your favorite fairy tale, and what do you think it is about these kinds of stories that have made them beloved for centuries?

Beauty and the Beast is probably my favorite fairy tale. A book-loving heroine and a wounded hero who must submit to the healing power of love—perfection! Several of my stories already use this trope in a subtle, nuanced way.

I believe fairy tales continue to connect with readers because there is something hopeful in the idea of love conquering all. That message calls to each of us because it is an echo of the gospel message. The love of Christ conquered all on the cross. No one is too far gone that his love cannot find and redeem, heal old wounds, and restore relationships. Fairy tales focus on a more romantic affection, but the message of good overcoming evil and love conquering any obstacle still resonates with a depth that harkens to something greater.

FF: Can you share a little about what similarities—and also maybe what differences—there are between your female protagonist, Penelope Snow, and the classic character Snow White?

There are several similarities between Penelope Snow and the classic Snow White. Penelope mirrors the fair looks of Snow White, with her pale complexion, dark hair, and overall beauty. But she is also very humble about her looks and even tries to hide them. She has suffered hardships in life that have relegated her to the role of a servant, yet she maintains a sweet, innocent spirit that cares less about herself and more about doing for others. Oh, and she enjoys talking to animals.

FF: One major theme *Fairest of Heart* addresses is acting with integrity amidst persecution. Can you tell us a little more about how these come into play in the lives of your protagonists and how it applies to us today?

I don't want to give away too much of the plot, but both Titus and Penelope fall victim to lies and deceit perpetrated by the villain. Things are made worse by painful incidents from the past that color the hero's perceptions. Penelope has to learn to stop hiding and take a stand against evil while Titus must

learn to see past his pain to find the truth. As often happens in our own lives, it's rarely one big instance when we need to act with integrity, but many little instances. Not giving in to the easy way in the small decisions of life builds our courage and conviction so that when large persecutions come, we can stand with integrity in a way that reflects well on our Lord.

FF: What inspired the idea for a series like this?

I've seen fairy tales retold in medieval settings, contemporary settings, fantasy and sci-fi settings, but there aren't too many that have been done in the Western genre. Since I love both fairy tales and cowboys, I couldn't pass up the chance to combine them in a fun new way.

FF: What do western historical romance readers have to look forward to in *Fairest of Heart* and the rest of the series?

The classic fairy tales you know and love won't just be getting a Western redesign, the stories themselves will be getting a twist. Fairest of Heart stays pretty close to the classic tale, but the next books in the series will mix things up a bit more. Stay tuned...

FF: Can you share what fairy tale retelling you're working on next?

Book two in the series will feature a Cinder-fella story that opens with a ball and a boot left behind. The gender role swap won't be the only twist in this story. Stepmother redemption, a villain rewrite, and an imaginary pair of sewing mice is but a taste of what is to come. **FF**

When Denise isn't orchestrating love lives on the written page, she enjoys traveling with her family, drinking chai lattes, and playing drums.

In this interview, Denise talks with us about her newest book, *A Novel Proposal*.

FF: What inspired the story in your book?

Many years ago I jotted a note for my idea folder: What if a woman is charged with writing a romance novel, but she's never been in love? When I was presented with the opportunity to write a stand-alone beach story, I knew the idea's time had finally come. This book is a light-hearted escape, but it also drives home the theme that love is a risk worth taking. I hope the reader feels all the ups and downs of falling in love for the first time, experienced from the point of view of a writer who's never been in love.

FF: What can you tell us about the main characters in your book?

Sadie Goodwin is an elementary school art teacher who fills her summers by writing western novels. She's vivacious and optimistic but tends to procrastinate difficult tasks. She yearns





for love but fears having the kind of unstable relationship her parents have. This paradox has made dating quite the challenge for her.

Sam Ford helps run his family's landscaping business. But a terrible betrayal has him holed up at the beach, hoping to escape the wedding preparations of his ex-girlfriend and cousin—and the pitying looks from friends and family alike. He wants love in his life but the betrayal has left him bitter and untrusting.

FF: Which character surprised you the most?

When Sadie and Sam first meet at the duplex they're renting for the summer, it's clear Sadie is the sunshine to Sam's grump. The contrasting personalities made for some amusing scenes and fun dialogue. But as the story progressed, I began to realize—as did Sadie—that Sam wasn't truly the curmudgeon he first appeared to be. He was just dealing with a wound that hadn't yet healed.

FF: What can you tell us about your next book?

I'm very excited to continue my *Riverbend Romance Series* with *Wildflower Falls*, which releases September 12, 2023. It's about a rancher who attempts to salvage her family farm by hiring a horse whisperer. But when feelings develop between the two of them, his nomadic lifestyle complicates matters. Though this is the fourth book of the series, it's also a great jumping-in point for new readers.

FF: What kind of research did you do for this book?

Since Sadie is a novelist, I had that end of the research covered. Deadline anxiety? Check. Procrastination? Check. Plotting problems? Check, check. In fact, I decided to add epigraphs at the beginning of each chapter. They come in the form of quotes from a fictitious book called *Romance Writing 101* and hint at what's to come in the chapter that follows.

I always travel to the location of the setting before I write a novel, and A Novel Proposal was no exception. I find I'm better able to bring a setting to life if I've experienced the area myself. Though Tucker Island is fictitious, it's loosely based on Tybee Island, South Carolina, which has a very charming, laid-back vibe.

FF: What do you want readers to take away after reading your book?

I love that in fiction we can step into the characters' worlds and walk with them through their trials. This allows us to learn from their mistakes in a completely safe way. Sam needs to forgive those who've hurt him and figure out how to trust again after a bitter betrayal. Sadie learns that love is a risk, but it's one worth taking with the right person.

FF: What are the biggest challenges for you as an author writing in your specific genre?

Having now penned more than forty novels, the challenge is always coming up with something fresh. Not only with the story's plot but also with those elements you find in every love story. How can I make this first kiss different than the other forty I've written? How can I make sure this protagonist's epiphany is unique? How is her journey to love different than others I've penned? Readers deserve something new and different each time they pick up one of my novels.

FF: What authors or books have inspired you as an author? I'm an avid reader, so there are probably hundreds of authors who've inspired me along the way. My critique partner Colleen Coble comes to mind. In my early years, the writings of Francine Rivers, Angela Hunt, and Gilbert Morris served as inspiration.

FF: How has your faith or world view impacted the way you tell stories?

The *Bible* serves as my compass for right and wrong in life and in my novels. Even in some of my stories where faith isn't necessarily front and center, my protagonists have that same compass. I strive to create story worlds that will be a safe place for readers to not only escape life's troubles, but to learn and grow emotionally and spiritually. **FF**

Susan is the winner of a RITA Award and multiple Christy and Carol Awards, as well as the HOLT Medallion and numerous Readers' Choice Awards.

In this interview, Susan talks about **Sundown**, the third book in her **Sky King Ranch Series**.

FF: Please provide a brief summary of your new novel, Sundown.

Sundown is the epic conclusion to the Sky King Ranch Trilogy. Taylor "Tae" Price is hiding something—former Delta Operator Colt Kingston knows it. But she's not talking...at least until she's targeted by a Russian assassin. Then suddenly she has a story that no one believes, except, maybe Colt. And not just because she helped nurse him back to his feet after his terrible captivity in Nigeria. There's something about Tae's story that rings true, even if it feels unbelievable that she alone holds the antidote to a terrible biological threat. Colt and Tae—and the rest of the Sky King Ranch family—must race against time to stop the attack.

FF: Your female protagonist, Tae, comes to Sky King Ranch with a lot of secrets. Can you offer some hints as to how these secrets could have a huge impact on the world?

Tae works for a private group that researches rogue, virulent

strains of already known diseases—Ebola, hantavirus, smallpox, etc. When one of these kinds of diseases is unleashed, it's up to her to find the cure.

FF: Colt Kingston, one of the three triplets featured in the *Sky King Ranch Series*, is a former Delta Operative. Can you explain what this profession entails and why it is important in *Sundown*?

Delta Force is a special ops group within the US Army that operates under special command of the Joint Special Operations Command. They specialize in counterterrorism, hostage rescue, and recon, often with high-value targets. This is especially important because Colt comes to the story with specific skills that allow him to direct action against the group producing the virus. His experience is exactly what they need to find and stop the terrorists.

FF: The Sky King Ranch Series is set in Alaska, which is often referred to as the Last Frontier. Why did you choose this setting?

Alaska is its own amazing character! I love the setting because it challenges our characters to go beyond themselves to look within and find courage they didn't know they had. Setting a book in Alaska allows me to create desperate scenarios that add to both the suspense and character growth. It is just hands-down, mind-blowingly beautiful.

FF: Sundown is the final book in your Sky King Ranch Series. What is the connecting element for all of the books in this series?

All of the brothers have returned home wounded in some way, both physically and mentally, so coming back to the ranch

offers them a place to confront those wounds and heal. Also, the appearance of Tae in book 1 is threaded through the series and connects all three books in the epic plot.

FF: Are there any threads that run through the whole series that will be wrapped up in *Sundown*?

There are many threads!! Some, of course, I can't give away, but all the characters have ongoing problems, question or issues that in some way get resolved or answered, from family problems to health issues to backstory questions.

FF: What inspired the idea for this series?

The idea began years ago when I penned a different series about Alaskan smokejumpers and readers first met Larke, the brothers' oldest sister. My fans reached out and asked me for the triplets' stories, and suddenly all three brothers walked into my brain with their problems and started talking!

FF: What lessons do you hope readers can gain from reading *Sundown*?


The series is really about how we need to take a long-range view of our lives, because God is active and working on our story even when we feel alone. I hope readers are encouraged to trust the Lord and see that no situation is out of his control.

FF: What do you love most about writing romance novels packed with both action and adventure?

I love meeting and falling in love with my heroes! They are so fun to write about, and getting them into trouble—and out of it—with the right partner is a blast!. **FF**

HISTORICAL ROMANCE Julie Klassen A Winter by the Sea

Julie Klassen loves all things Jane—Jane Eyre and Jane Austen. Her books have sold more than 1.5 million copies, and she is a three-time recipient of the Christy Award. The Secret of Pembrooke Park was honored with the Minnesota Book Award for Genre Fiction. Julie has also won the Christian Retailing's Best Award and has been a finalist in the RITA and Carol Awards.

In this interview, Julie talks about book number two in her On Devonshire Shores Series, A Winter by the Sea.

FF: Can you please tell us a little bit about your new novel, A Winter by the Sea?

Happily. As the book opens, the Summers family expect a quiet winter. Instead the Duke and Duchess of Kent and their baby daughter (the future Queen Victoria) rent the neighboring house, and the sisters are called upon to host a few members of staff. Emily Summers soon finds herself caught up in two rivalries. First, while striving to further her writing aspirations, Emily is torn between her loyalty to a well-established publisher and his flamboyant competitor. Second, despite her best intentions, she is attracted to one of their new guests, until an unexpected visitor from her past shows up.

FF: What do readers need to know about Emily Summers, your main female protagonist? How is Emily different from her three sisters?

Emily is the writer of the family and dreams of becoming a published author. She has a passionate nature and sometimes

speaks her mind without considering the consequences. Her bright, flirtatious manner shields a heart broken by a past rejection.

FF: This novel takes place in Devonshire during the winter of 1819–1820. What else can you tell us about the historical context and time period that influenced the creation of this novel?

It was an interesting period in British history. The Prince Regent's only daughter had died, spurring his brothers into a race to produce a legitimate heir to the throne. Prince Edward, the Duke of Kent, was the first to achieve this. He was also considered to be the strongest and healthiest of the Prince Regent's brothers. At the time, there was every reason to believe Prince Edward might one day be king and if so, his baby daughter would be next in line. However, he was also deeply in debt and was advised to move to the West Country to live more economically. Sidmouth was his chosen winter residence.

FF: Speaking of the Duke of Kent, he makes an appearance in this story as one of the peripheral characters. Do you typically include real figures from history in your novels? Why choose to include the Duke and Duchess?

Not usually. I have more historical characters in the first two books of this series than in any of my other novels. When I learned that the Duke and Duchess of Kent visited Sidmouth that year and stayed in Woolbrook Cottage (on the same lane as fictional Sea View), I knew I wanted to include them. They arrived with too many attendants to accommodate in the house they'd rented, so some of their staff were indeed lodged elsewhere. The duke's time in Sidmouth was brief and punctuated by dramatic events, which I hope readers will find as interesting as I did.





FF: What themes present themselves throughout the novel? Which one do you think speaks most to readers today?

Through the character of Emily, a passionate lover of books, the novel celebrates the power of literature and romance. A Winter by the Sea also explores the human heart's capacity to change over time and through circumstances—one's deepest desires with it. I hope readers will relate to both themes.

FF: What will fans of romance love about the complicated relationships between Emily and her past love as well as the one she has with James Thomson?

My hope is that readers will enjoy the romantic sparks that develop between Emily and James—a handsome new guest who seems out of reach—and also empathize with her as she is torn between her growing feelings for him and her long devotion to a first love.

FF: What was the most interesting thing you discovered while researching for this book or the series as a whole? I found it interesting to learn about the Duke and Duchess of

Kent as well as other historical figures living in Sidmouth at this time. Also, I continue to enjoy learning about seaside customs and strongly held beliefs about the health benefits of seabathing (even in winter).

FF: Can you elaborate on that? Historically, many people moved to Sidmouth to improve their health by the seaside, but what were the benefits?

The supposed health benefits of sea air, sea-bathing, and even drinking seawater were promoted by seaside resort towns as well as physicians who published books on the topic. The salt in seawater was thought to increase circulation and remove obstacles from the glands and was used to treat whooping cough, rickets, scurvy, colic, and many other ailments. Jane Austen wrote (in her unfinished novel, *Sanditon*): No person could be really well...could be really in a state of secure and permanent health without spending at least six weeks by the sea every year. The sea air and sea bathing together were nearly infallible...for every disorder of the stomach, the lungs or the blood; they were anti-spasmodic, anti-pulmonary, anti-sceptic, anti-bilious and anti-rheumatic.

FF: What do you love most about writing stories set in the Regency period?


I love the romance of the era: gentlemanly chivalry and ladylike modesty, grand manors and balls, where a dance, a lingering look, or a fleeting touch of gloved hands sparked romance. Of course, I've done enough research to know it was not all romantic. There was plenty of scandal and bad behavior then as now. And I would NOT want to be subjected to the medical practices of the period!

FF: Can you share a little about how you plan to wrap up this series?

I have begun work on a third novel, and plan to wrap up the series with a Christmas novella. **FF**
